

What or Which

O que/Qual ou Qual/Quais

"What" is more general and open-ended, while "which" is used when you have a specific set of options in mind, and you want to distinguish between them. The choice between these words depends on the context and the type of information you are seeking.

WHAT:

"What" is a more general question word. It is used to inquire about something when you are not specifying a limited set of options. It is often used when you are asking for a definition, description, or explanation.

Example: "What is your favorite color?" (The answer could be any color.)

WHICH:

"Which" is used when you have a specific set of options or choices in mind, and you want to select or identify one from that set. It implies that there are limited choices, and you are asking the person to make a selection or clarify from those choices.

Example: "Which book do you want to read, the red one or the blue one?"
